April 27, 2020

The Jefferson County Board of Commissioners convened in regular session on Monday, April 27 at 1:00 p.m. Present were Commissioners Lynn Luck, Wayne Ledbetter and Richard Malm. Also present were Counselor Josh Ney and County Clerk Linda M. Buttron.

Richard moved that the minutes of April 20, 2020 be approved as presented. Wayne seconded. All voted in favor of the motion.

James Tweed, Emergency Services Director reported statistics on the COVID19 virus. He stated that citizens need to continue to be on guard, stay vigilant and continue to practice social distancing and other preventive measures. There are 3,174 cases in Kansas. Jefferson County has 8 cases. Six have recovered. One is expected to be released this week and one is in Hospice Care.

James discussed an application with FEMA for reimbursement of overtime paid to Emergency Managers during this health emergency.

Lynn announced that on Friday the Board will hold a special meeting at 9:00 to discuss the COVID restrictions with the Health Department Officer.

The Board met with a candidate for an interview for the Public Works Director position. Lynn moved that the Board recess into executive session to discuss matters of non-elected personnel for an interview until 2:15 p.m. Wayne seconded. All voted in favor of the motion. The Board adjourned at 1:45 p.m. Present during the session was the candidate and the Board. The Board reconvened at 2:15 p.m. The chair announced that no binding action was taken during executive session.

There being no further business to come before the Board they adjourned to meet in special session on May 1 and regular session on May 4th.
